Fey at the State Farm 10-mile run in Lincoln. He finished third, averaging 5:20/mile in preparation for the 2009 Boston Marathon where he finished 77th out of 25,000 runners with a 2 hour, 33 minute clocking. The book can be found at The Bookworm at Countryside Village (directly north of Westside High School).

When Derek Fey entered Westside High School in 1994, he was destined to be the next starting center fielder for the Warriors. Unfortunately, he couldn't hit a baseball if his life depended on it, and it wasn't hard for the freshman coach at the time, Brett Froendt, to determine that baseball wasn't in the cards. Fortunately, for Fred Hutchinson and Rick McKeever, the track team was about to benefit.

"I remember Coach Hutchinson asking me the first day: 'Where the heck have you been?'" Fey said. "I had never met him, but I knew that it was the start of a great relationship."

By the time Fey graduated in 1998, Westside's boys track team was in the midst of an impressive run. During his junior and senior years, Westside won every track meet they attended, with the exception of the state meet and one district/metro meet. He finished off his high school career at the state track meet with a six-second personal best in the mile with a 4 minute, 25 second clocking, placing fourth overall.

"Westside, and track especially, taught me so many things about life," Fey said. "We were determined, dedicated, and we learned how to deal with adversity on many levels."

Dana College offered a scholarship and the Vikings at the time were a top-five NAIA cross country program. Fey would place fifth on a team that finished fifth at the NAIA National Cross Country Meet, earn a school record in the half-marathon (with a time of 1 hour, nine

minutes), and become an NAIA All-American in track and field in the marathon. And that was just his freshman year.

He would add another All-America title at the NAIA National Cross Country Meet in 2000, placing 15th in the country. During his senior year at Dana, Fey won the Great Plains Athletic Conference Cross Country Championship.

"We had a lot of fun in Blair," Fey said. "When you are as successful as we were, it makes running, arguably the toughest sport in the world, rather easy"

In 2002, he would place third at the Jacksonville Marathon, and two years later,

second at the Lincoln Marathon.

In 2006, Fey was named the head men's and women's cross country coach at Dana.

After receiving a teaching degree from the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2007, Fey took over the boys cross country program at Westside High School. One year later, he started teaching seventh grade social studies at Westside Middle School.

About three years ago, he started writing a document about running. It started out as a motivational manuscript, but developed into something larger. When his alma mater, Dana College, closed last summer, the manuscript developed into a book dedicated to his former college team.

We Were Born to Run was published in March 2011. The book includes a thorough history of Dana Cross Country, including an examination of Dana's former coach, Jay Birmingham. Birmingham is a journey runner, and holds the national record for the Transamerica run (Los Angeles to New York City), which he completed in just under 73 days. He ran the entire distance solo. Birmingham also was the second person to ever run from the lowest point in the contiguous United States to the highest (Death Valley to Mt. Whitney).

It also looks at coaching advice, racing strategy, how to be successful at running, and finally, an argument for running being the greatest sport in the world.

"It has been quite the undertaking and I've learned a lot about the book industry," Fey said. "My father wrote for the Omaha World-Herald for 20 years and my brother was an editor for Baseball Weekly, so writing is definitely in my blood. I just didn't know how difficult it was until I got near the end."

WESTSIDE HONORS HALL OF FAME AND LIGHTHOUSE LEADER RECIPIENTS

Westside Community Schools honored four individuals during the District's 2010 Hall of Fame/Lighthouse Leader dinner. The event took place at the Happy Hollow Club on Thursday, October 21. Westside Alumnus Michael Hopkins, Ph.D., class of 1976, was honored as the Westside Alumni Association Hall of Fame recipient. Carrie and Ed May and Bob Belgrade were honored as Lighthouse Leader recipients. A brief description of all the award recipients is included below.

Michael Hopkins, '76

Michael Hopkins, a 1976 graduate of Westside High School, has distinguished himself with a lifelong commitment to education. In 2009, in collaboration with fellow mathematicians, he announced the solution of the Kervaire invariant problem. The mathematics question, which went unsolved for more than four decades, deals with the shape of high dimensional spaces. With a D.Phil. from the University of Oxford and a Ph.D. from Northwestern University, the algebraic topologist currently works as a Professor of Mathematics at Harvard University. His past academic positions have included work as a Professor at MIT, a Professor at the University of Chicago and an Assistant Professor at Princeton University. His numerous awards and honors include a Rhodes scholarship, the Presidential Young

Investigator Award and the Oswald Veblen Prize in Geometry. Michael is an Alfred P. Sloan Fellow, a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and a foreign member of the Royal Danish Academy of Sciences and Letters. He holds editorships with several academic journals, including the Quarterly Journal of Mathematics, K-theory, and Advances in Mathematics.

Bob Belgrade, '76

Bob Belgrade, a 1976 graduate of Westside High School, has been a longtime supporter of Westside Community Schools. Along with retired Superintendent Jim Tangdall and others, Bob helped to start the Hall of Fame Golf Tournament in 1994. Today, proceeds raised from the golf tournament go toward special projects, student scholarships and gifts to Westside High School, expenses for Hall of Fame honorees, and educational grants to teachers and to the community. In addition to his work with the Hall of Fame golf tournament, Bob is active as a volunteer for other community organizations. He volunteers at the University of Nebraska Medical Center, and serves on the UNMC Board of Counselors. He has served on the Jewish Federation of Omaha and Jewish Senior Services. He is the past-President of the Rose Blumkin Jewish Home and is an ex-officio board member of the Nebraska Jewish

Historical Society. Bob is a 1981 graduate of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He is employed with the Belgrade Company, a family business that deals in real estate development and property management

Carrie and Ed May

Carrie and Ed May have distinguished themselves as strong supporters of Westside Community Schools. Ed, a 1976 graduate of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, served as a Westside Community Schools Board Member from 2004-2010. Carrie, a 1978 graduate of Iowa State University and a 1974 graduate of Westside High School, has served as a Board Member for the Westside Alumni Association. Both Ed and Carrie have served as HOSTS mentors at Hillside Elementary. Most recently, the couple served as chairs for the Westside High School Vocal Music Parents Association. Their service to the community extends well beyond Westside Community Schools. The couple has chaired the Henry Doorly Zoo Membership Drive and the Heartland Family Service Annual Champions Drive. Ed and Carrie have served on a variety of community boards, including the Boys/Girls Club, Kicks for a Cure, the Omaha Public Library Foundation, the Ak-Sar-Ben Ball Committee, the Omaha Children's Museum, the American Red Cross and the Omaha Community Foundation. In 2011, Ed and Carrie will act as Honorary Chairs for Westside Community School's VI-VI Gala.

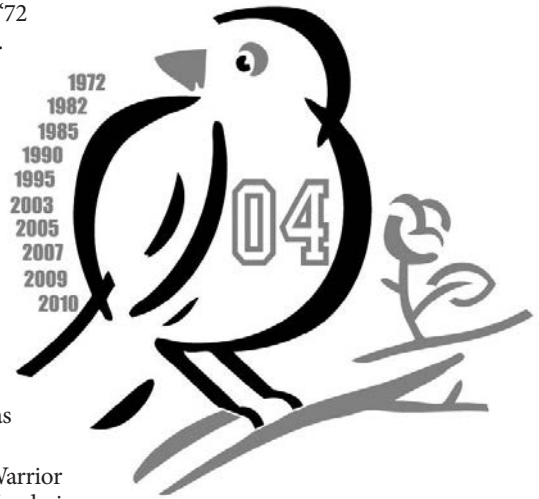

Ultimately the teams of '03 and '04 earned berths in the championship game. Led by Ross Sinclair, Alec Young (the initial Tom Hall Scholarship award winner), Aaron Brandon and Mark Duggan, among others, the Class of '03 played a close game but lost out to the Class of '04, led by Andy West, UNO standout Denny Johnston, Joe Finocchiaro, Justin Loehr, Andy McAvin, Conner O'Neill and Ty Jansen.

Following the tournament, all participants enjoyed Little Caesar's Pizza, donated by Curt Huston, '81 who is a former participant in the tournament and a long time supporter of the tournament with his generous contributions.

Teams from '03, '04, and '05 have now won the last 6 tournaments, rivaling the dynasty of the 1990 team in the early years of the tourney. Please mark your calendars for the next tournament, which will be held Saturday, November 26, 2011, beginning at 2 p.m., at the WHS gym. Spectators are welcome, and we are seeing more and more cheerleaders attend. Female players are also welcome. The entry fee is \$10, and additional donations toward the scholarship are welcome.
